Beef Show Rules & Requirements

- 1. Exhibitor Eligibility:** Open to youth that are between the ages of 8 and 21 as of January 1st, 2026. This show is sanctioned by MI Cattlemen Showcase Series. We welcome youth with chronological age greater than 21 years of age who participate in 4-H or school activities with their developmental aged peers, to participate in showmanship. (As recommended by the American with Disabilities Act).
- 2. Entries:** Entries must be made using Showman.app **ONLY**. On or before June 19, 2026 entry fees are non-refundable \$50 for each Market/Breeding Animal entered. \$35 for each Prospect calf Beef/Dairy/Heifer (under 600lbs). **Late Entries** will be accepted after June 19, 2026 of an additional fee of \$20 per entry made using the Showman app.
- 3. Check In:** Check in will be Sunday, June 21 from 7:00am to 9:00am. Registration certificates are required for this show. RFID tags are required for all animals.
- 4. Showmanship:** Participants must sign up for showmanship with entry. Showmanship will begin at 10:00 am. PeeWee (Cloverbud), Seniors (18-21), Intermediate (15-17), Juniors (12-14), and Beginner (8-11). Classes will be divided by age as of 1/1/26. Exhibitors must show their own animals. (PeeWee may show any animal entered and

must have a parent or helper with them)

5. **Grooming Regulations:** NO FORCED ADMINISTRATION OF FLUIDS TO CREATE GUT FILL WILL NOT BE ALLOWED. NO PRODUCTS MAY BE ADMINISTERED ORALY OR INJECTED INTO THE ANIMAL. VIOLATION WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION OF EXHIBITOR AND ALL ENTRIES. Generators are recommended
6. **Responsibility:** Show Committee, sponsors and facility staff will not be responsible for any loss by death, injury, crippling, bruises, theft or condemnation.
7. **Facility:** All exhibitors must clean the area around their trailer/fitting area. No Bedding outside of trailers. Manure, hay, spilled bedding should be picked up and placed in the manure pit by the wash rack. No barns/stalling is available tie to trailers only. **No washing of cattle by livestock trailers all washing must be done at the wash rack!**
8. **Housing:** Camping is available at \$40 per night. Budget Motel M-89 & M-40 North (269)673-6622, Comfort Inn in Plainwell at exit 49A 269-685-9891 (this is 12.8 miles from Allegan)
9. **Breed Requirements:**
 - Angus Heifer & Steer:** Purebred Angus Registration Papers
 - Chi Heifer & Steer:** All registration papers issued by the ACA
 - Charolais:** Purebred registration papers
 - Char Composite:** Char Composite papers
 - Hereford Heifer & Steer:** Purebred Hereford Registration Papers
 - Maine:** Brown Registration papers issued by Maine Association
 - Mainetainer Heifer & Steer:** 25%-74% All Registration papers issued by the Maine Association
 - Shorthorn Heifer & Steer:** 15/16 – Shorthorn Registration Papers
 - Shorthorn Plus Heifer:** Minimum 50% Steer: Minimum 25% - - Shorthorn Plus Registration Papers
 - Purebred Simmental Heifer:** 7/8 or greater Simmental Registration Papers Steers: Show in AOB
 - Percentage Simmental Heifer & Steer:** Minimum 50% but no greater than 7/8 Simmental Registration Papers
 - All Other Registered breeds (AOB)** – animals with registration papers, but not meeting the requirements listed above. Include Limousin, Red Angus, lower percentage Simmental (less than ½) etc.
 - Dairy Market Animals** – Steers or heifers more than 50% dairy breeds. Will compete for overall market animal.
 - Commercial Heifer** – Heifers that are not eligible for registration. Age requirements are in effect and heifers will show by weight. These heifers will compete with breed heifers for Top 5 heifer.
 - Market Heifer** – Heifers that are shown by weight and will compete for overall market animal.
 - Crossbred Steer** – Steers that are not eligible for registration, typically of 2 or more mixed breeds.
10. **Dual registered animals** may only participate in one division.
11. **Disputes/Protests.** All disputes and/or protests should be submitted to Show Committee in writing. Resolution of all disputes and protest are the responsibility of the show committee and their designees.

Prospect and Market Animals

12. **Market Animals** will be shown by breed then weight light to heavy.
13. **Order:** Dairy Beef, Angus, AOB, Char, Char Composite, Chi, Hereford, Maine, Maintainer, Shorthorn, Shorthorn Plus, Percentage Simmental, Cross Steers, and Market Heifers. Class breaks will be determined after all entries have been processed.

Heifers

14. **Ages:** Heifers must have a birthdate on/after **September 1, 2024**. (Including Commercial heifers)
15. **Heifers** will show from youngest to oldest. Commercial heifers will show by weight light to heavy but must also meet the age requirements.
16. **Order:** Angus, AOB, Char, Char Composite, Chi, Hereford, Maine, Maintainer, Shorthorn, Shorthorn Plus, Simmental, Percentage Simmental, Commercial. Class breaks will be determined after all entries have been processed.

Prospect Calves

17. **Prospect calf classes** are open to calves weighting under 600lbs and will be shown by weight. Calves will be shown as breeding heifers, bulls & prospect market steers & dairy feeder calves. All calves must be weaned, any calf found to be still nursing at the show will be disqualified and not allowed to show.

County Bred Class

18. The county bred class is open to any animal that was born in **Allegan County**. This class will be judged as a market Class. Only a Champion & Reserve will be chosen.

TB and Health Requirements

All cattle participating in the 2026 Allegan County Spectacular Livestock Show must have an RFID/EID tag. Neither an official USDA alphanumeric metal ear tag nor an official breed registry tattoo will be accepted in place of an RFID tag. Please refer to the 2026 Health Requirements Livestock Exhibited in Michigan – www.michigan.gov/mda-exhibitinfo.

By completing entry to this show, exhibitors and families/guests are agreeing to the follow rules printed in this entry packet as well as any additional rules and/or guidelines that the show committee, facility staff or show officials deem necessary.

Lamb & Goat Show Rules & Requirements

- 1. Exhibitor Eligibility:** Open to youth that are between the ages of 8 and 21 as of January 1st, 2026. This show is sanctioned by the MCLA Youth Challenge and the MI Club Goats. We welcome youth with chronological age greater than 21 years of age who participate in 4-H or school activities with their developmental aged peers, to participate in showmanship. (As recommended by the American with Disabilities Act).
- 2. Entries:** Entries must be made using Showman.app **ONLY**. On or before June 19, 2026 entry fees are non-refundable \$35 for each Market/Breeding Animal entered. **Late Entries** will be accepted after June 19, 2026 of an additional fee of \$20 per entry made using the Showman app.

3. **Check In:** Check in will be Saturday, June 20 from 7:30am to 9:00am.
4. **Showmanship:** Participants must sign up for showmanship with entry. Showmanship will begin at 10:00 am. PeeWee (Cloverbud), Seniors (18-21), Intermediate (15-17), Juniors (12-14), and Beginner (8-11). Classes will be divided by age as of 1/1/26. Exhibitors must show their own animals.
5. **Grooming Regulations:** All lambs must be shorn within 5 days of the show weight in
6. **Responsibility:** Show Committee, sponsors and facility staff will not be responsible for any loss by death, injury, crippling, bruises, theft or condemnation.
7. **Facility:** All exhibitors must clean the area around their trailer/fitting area. No Bedding outside of trailers. Manure, hay, spilled bedding should be picked up and placed in the manure pit by the wash rack. No barns/stalling is available tie to trailers only. **No washing of Lambs or goats by livestock trailers all washing must be done at the wash rack!**
8. **Housing:** Camping is available at \$40 per night. Budget Motel M-89 & M-40 North (269)673-6622, Comfort Inn in Plainwell at exit 49A 269-685-9891 (this is 12.8 miles from Allegan)

Market Lambs & Commercial Ewes

9. **Market Lambs** will be shown by Whiteface or Blackface Crossbred then weight light to heavy.
10. **Reweight:** Top 3 In each class for Market Lambs will reweight following each class entered and must be within 7 pounds of their declared weight.
11. **Commercial Ewes:** All breeds of sheep are eligible to show
12. **Commercial Ewe Lambs** may be entered in both the market class and commercial lamb class.
13. **Commercial Ewe Lamb Classes** will be shown by weight with a Top 5 Overall chosen.

Market Goats & Wether Dam Does

14. Market Goat division (Boer & Dairy) will consist of slicked market goats (wether or doe) judged on market traits and classed by weight. (Slicked Does may show in both divisions but must pay for both classes)
15. **Market Dairy Goats must be 100% Dairy Breed any Dairy Cross Market goats will show in the Boer Market Show.**
16. **Reweight:** Top 3 in each class of market goats will reweight following each class entered and must be within 7 pounds of their declared weight.
17. **Wether Dam Doe** Division will consist of does, slicked or in hair, judged on breeding traits for a market goat. Does may be shown in hair or slicked and will be classed by weight. The show committee reserves the right to separate classes by slick/hair based on discretion/entries, but an Overall Top 3 doe will be picked regardless of class separation. All does must be under 1 year old to compete in this division.
